Read 1 Corinthians 15:1

Gospel comes from the Greek word “euangelion.” We get our word “evangelize” or “evangelism” from it. It means, “Good News!” and encompasses the Person, Words, and Works of Jesus.

1. What does it *feel* like to “stand” in the Gospel? What confidence do you experience in the Gospel—especially in challenging times?
2. What does it *look* like to “stand” in the Gospel? What do those in your life observe in you that gives them confidence?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:3-8

3. Jesus died for our sins, was buried, was raised, and appeared alive. Paul says this is the Gospel in a nutshell and is “of first importance.” In challenging times people are more open to “faith.” And, in challenging times, many voices often communicate confusing messages about “faith.” We need to share the message “of first importance” with our network of people boldly, compassionately and clearly. What are some practical ways in this new, 100% virtual world we’re all living in that you can do this?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:9-11

4. Paul said, “by the grace of God I am what I am” and then noted that God’s grace in his life “was not in vain.” How does Paul’s testimony impact your understanding of grace? How does it impact your zeal to share the gospel with ALL people?
5. Share how you have experienced God’s grace in your life.
